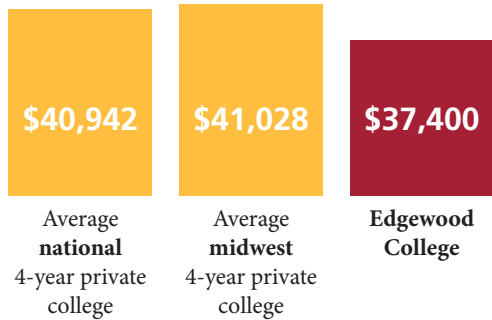

- The College is often able to provide a financial aid package that is competitive with nearly every institution that a student is considering
- 95% of our full time undergraduate students receive institutional grants, such as scholarships and fellowships.

HOW DO NAMED SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS SUPPORT STUDENTS?

- In addition to financial aid, students benefit greatly from the generosity of private benefactors. In 2015-2016, students received financial support from 132 unique annual and endowed scholarship funds.
- 236 students received awards from these funds.
- The average family income of these students is \$55,276.
- Most scholarship awards ranged from \$500 - \$10,000. The average scholarship award was \$3,858.
- The College guarantees a consistent level of annual financial support for eligible student recipients who maintain full-time continuous enrollment, through both institutional aid and scholarship support. Consistent scholarship support helps make this possible.
